Elections Matter!

2010 Election Season is Most Competitive in Decades

From the top of the ballot on down, the Commonwealth of Massachusetts is witnessing some of the highest turnover in state government in its history. NARAL Pro-Choice Massachusetts is committed to electing pro-choice politicians across the state, so we are very excited to see so many new pro-choice candidates running this year along with the pro-choice incumbents who are up for re-election.

The NARAL Pro-Choice Massachusetts PAC has endorsed four candidates for statewide office along with 75 candidates for the House of Representatives and 21 candidates for the Massachusetts Senate for the fall 2010 elections.

A strong champion of choice, Governor Deval Patrick faces a serious challenge this year, so we are proud to endorse him again. We are also delighted to support another pro-choice leader – Attorney General Martha Coakley – in her re-election bid. The statewide races for Auditor and Treasurer are also grab-

bing headlines. Five candidates – only three of whom are pro-choice – are vying to replace Auditor Joe DeNucci, who is stepping down after 23 years in that post. Three candidates are also running for the job of state treasurer, and we are excited to have endorsed Steve Grossman for that office.

The House of Representatives will see the greatest turnover once the dust settles. Currently, 95 of those 160 seats are held by pro-choice legislators. More than half (55) of these pro-choice seats are in play. With our *Protect and Elect Campaign*, NARAL Pro-Choice Massachusetts and our allies will work hard to maintain our pro-choice majority in the lower chamber.

In the Senate, there are currently 27 pro-choice seats. The vast majority of those seats (21) are in play, so our *Protect and Elect* teams are already in full swing to safeguard our strong majority there. And, with a record eight open Senate seats (where no incumbent is running), we have a greater chance to elect

pro-choice candidates to former anti-choice or mixed-choice seats.

With the tumultuous political climate that has engulfed the country, anything could happen this fall. The record number of open seats only makes this election cycle more unpredictable and thus more important for those of us who care about reproductive freedom to get involved!

Protect and Elect Campaign in Full Swing

Interns and Volunteers Help Pro-Choice Candidates Across the State

Each election cycle, NARAL Pro-Choice Massachusetts works to make the pro-choice voice heard and elect pro-choice candidates through our *Protect and Elect Campaign*. Eight dedicated interns from across the country

joined us this summer to help protect the pro-choice majority that we all worked so hard to elect in 2004. From educating voters at their homes and on the phone to staffing campaign events and marching with candidates in local parades, our interns and volunteers have traveled all around the state to stand up for reproductive freedom. To date, they have spent more than 1,000 hours talking to voters on behalf of more than 15 pro-choice candidates endorsed by NARAL Pro-Choice Massachusetts.

Our *Protect and Elect Campaign* is also committed to strengthening our grassroots network of pro-choice activists. The team has attended events in many communities asking

people to sign a pledge to vote pro-choice in the upcoming elections. These efforts have already yielded 1,200 pledges from new activists. In an election year with an unprecedented

number of competitive races where so much is at stake, our work is essential to ensure that we safeguard privacy and expand access to reproductive health care for all women and families in the Commonwealth.

As summer comes to a close and our interns head back to school, we will be

How to Use the Voters' Guide

Information about endorsements and candidates running for State Representative and State Senate is organized by legislative district. We have included the name of the incumbent representing each district in parentheses for your reference.

Key to Candidate Ratings

Ratings are based on a candidate's voting record, responses to our questionnaire, and/or information gathered by the NARAL Pro-Choice Massachusetts Political Committee.

ENDORSED Candidate is endorsed by NARAL Pro-Choice Massachusetts.

Pro-Choice Candidate believes abortion should be safe, legal, and accessible; supports access to family planning services and comprehensive health education, including information about abstinence and contraception.

Anti-Choice Candidate opposes a woman's right to choose abortion or supports it in such limited circumstances as to render the right to choose meaningless.

Mixed Candidate supports a woman's right to choose with restrictions.

Unknown Candidate's stance is unclear.

Note: Some legislators rated "Anti-Choice" or "Mixed" support access to family planning services and/or comprehensive health education.

NARAL Pro-Choice Massachusetts Endorsement Policy

NARAL Pro-Choice Massachusetts endorses candidates with strong pro-choice positions and structured campaigns. Since we place a high priority on issue leadership and a pro-choice voting record, in certain races we have endorsed one pro-choice candidate over another.

In races where we have made an endorsement, we list only the endorsed candidate.

In races where we have not made an endorsement, we list every candidate in the race and their positions on choice.

A Note About the Candidate Questionnaire

NARAL Pro-Choice Massachusetts sent questionnaires to every candidate running for an open seat, targeted challengers, and incumbents whose record and/or positions were unknown to the organization.

The questionnaire addresses a range of reproductive rights and health issues, including *Roe v. Wade*, restrictions on access to abortion care, Medicaid funding for abortions, comprehensive health education, the repeal of anti-choice statutes still in effect in Massachusetts, funding for family planning services and teen pregnancy prevention programs, and efforts to eliminate racial and ethnic health disparities. Responses to the questionnaire were used to assess candidates' positions.

Statewide Races

Governor and Lieutenant Governor:

NARAL Pro-Choice Massachusetts endorses Deval Patrick and Tim Murray for re-election.

What these positions do:

The Governor and Lieutenant Governor act as the Chief Executive Officer and Chief Operating Officer of the Commonwealth, respectively. The Governor presents an annual budget and signs (or vetoes) all laws passed by the legislature. The Governor also makes important state-level appointments, including the Commonwealth's Secretary of Health and Human Services.

Why pro-choice candidates matter:

It is vital that the Commonwealth have a pro-choice Governor and Lieutenant Governor to ensure that a woman's right to choose is not compromised. In his first term, Governor Patrick rejected federal funding for "abstinence-only-until-marriage" education and signed the Buffer Zone Bill into law to protect patients and staff entering reproductive health facilities.

Attorney General:

NARAL Pro-Choice Massachusetts endorses Martha Coakley for re-election.

What this position does:

As the chief law enforcement agent in the Commonwealth, the Attorney General enforces the laws of the Commonwealth, prosecuting criminals and filing suit on behalf of the state and its citizens. The Attorney General handles issues ranging from civil rights to consumer protection and health care fraud.

Why a pro-choice candidate matters:

Laws protecting reproductive freedom are always under attack. It is essential that the Attorney General vigorously defend legal protections for a woman's right to choose in the courts. For example, when the Buffer Zone Law faced a legal challenge from anti-choice activists, Attorney General Coakley defended the need for this public safety law.

Treasurer:

NARAL Pro-Choice Massachusetts endorses Steve Grossman for State Treasurer.

What this position does:

The Treasurer acts as the Chief Financial Officer of the Commonwealth. This constitutional office delivers reports about the fiscal stability of the Commonwealth and oversees the state pension system, abandoned properties, and the lottery.

Why a pro-choice candidate matters:

NARAL Pro-Choice Massachusetts has never previously supported a candidate for state treasurer. We do so this year because Steve Grossman (D-Newton) has been committed to advancing women's equality and reproductive rights throughout his career, and he will be a strong pro-choice leader if elected.

Auditor:

NARAL Pro-Choice Massachusetts has not endorsed in this race. However, we encourage you to vote for one of the three pro-choice candidates running: Suzanne Bump (D-Great Barrington), Guy Glodis (D-Worcester), and Mike Lake (D-Boston).

What this position does:

The Auditor of the Commonwealth is the state's fiscal watchdog. The office tracks how state funds are spent and ensures efficiency in state government; it can audit state agencies to protect taxpayer dollars.

Why a pro-choice candidate matters:

The Commonwealth has a demonstrated commitment to support a woman's ability to make reproductive decisions, regardless of her income, by funding the full range of reproductive health options through a host of public health programs. A pro-choice auditor is important to prevent politics from compromising funding streams associated with family planning and reproductive health services.

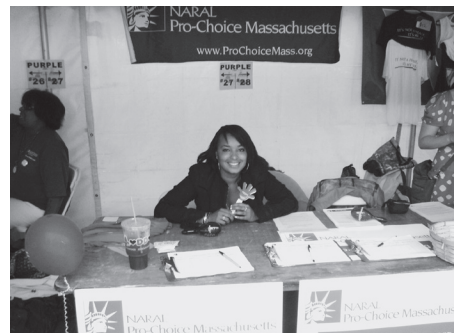
